This area has been identified as an extremely important production area for amphibians, lamprey, salmon and trout and elk. Historically it was also a very important site for Cowichan Tribes a complete archaeological assessment has not been completed but it is known that there was a longhouse at the site. It was also noted that given the Watershed Board's target of protecting 50% of the 70% shoreline habitats at the lake that are relatively unimpacted, some form of protection of these parcels of this site should be considered. |
