- 15 regional and technical FN delegates at table
- FNFC acts as secretariat
- BC Water table is a collaborative process with delegates from FNFC Water Caucus and multiple Provincial Ministries
- Broader aim is to lead to lasting policy, solutions and actions as opposed to ad hoc engagement
- Need to bring different Ministries to the Water Table in the context of DRIPA and several ministries (not just WLRS) engaged at tier 2 table
- Co-developed Water Security Strategy with Govt. of BC
 - Not a crown process collaborative process resulting in an Intentions Paper 2023
 - o Now working on co-developing an implementation plan
- Water Security Fund to be co-developed with First Nations interim home is REFBC & Water Caucus/FNFC
- Minister Neill has expressed support for this collaborative approach
 - o Need to continue to bring BC along
 - o Giving voice to the natural world

<u>Dialogue</u>

- Lydia speaks to the importance of regular quarterly meetings
 - o Face to face engagement important
 - o Feels positive about this model's effectiveness in bringing an Indigenous perspective to the table
- Lower Fraser WC representative
 - o Speaks to the importance of CWB as a model demonstrating potential for nations to begin to act as "first responders" and how demonstration of a successful watershed scale model governance model is important...
